Paradiso

Danas kada se sva nastojanja kulturno – umjetničkog djelovanja unaprijed proglašavaju uzaludnima i naivnima, u vremenu izokrenutih vrijednosti, inferiornosti morala, idolopoklonstva krivim ikonama, nepostojanja prave, ljudske komunikacije, dragocjene su želje i pokušaji pojedinaca da ukažu na suprotno, na potrebu egzistencije „duhovnih oaza“, kulturnih i umjetničkih mikro svjetova unutar kaotičnog makrokozmosa. Likovna kolonija Paradiso od 2000. godine ukazuje na te potrebe, ali i na aktualnost i životnost umjetnosti, na nepomirljivost sa stečenim stanjem, na bogatstvo likovne produkcije unatoč epohalnoj krizi i uspostavu novih ideja koje umjetnici afirmiraju svojim radovima. I tako svake godine, od spomenute 2000.g., upravo iz tih pobuda likovna kolonija Paradiso, kao projekt galerije Makek - Paradiso, otvara svoja vrata ljubiteljima umjetnosti i naravno, samim umjetnicima kako bi ukazala i pokazala da je umjetnička praksa itekako živa, jedinstvena i da ne jenjava s novim generacijama. Likovna kolonija Paradiso povezuje i paralelno predstavlja hrvatsku i inozemnu recentnu likovnu produkciju s ciljem da interakcijom raznorodnih stilskih, ikonoloških i kulturoloških izričaja potvrdi potrebu za globalnim promišljanjem i djelovanjem. Ne ograničavajući se samo na europsku likovnu umjetnost, ali uzimajući ju kao bazu, likovna kolonija Paradiso, tj. galerija Makek – Paradiso svojom organizatorskom i izlagачkom djelatnošću apostrofira europsko kulturno jedinstvo i važnost u predstavljanju i promociji vlastite zemlje. I ove godine likovna kolonija održala se tri puta, u tri saziva, nakon kojih su upriličene i izložbe radova. Ucrtavajući grad Rab na europsku likovnu kartu kao važnu kulturno-umjetničku točku ove godine kolonija ugostila je kroz tri saziva iznimne hrvatske i inozemne likovne stvaraoce, upriličivši i tri izložbe radova nastalih tijekom njihova boravka na koloniji u Rabu. Trideset i osmero umjetnika iz jedanaest europskih zemalja transponiralo je doživljaj u različite izraze, u subjektivna djela koja, postajući objektivne činjenice, prenose ideje ljepote, nove duhovnosti, svjedoče globalno promišljanje i inferiornost vremenskih i prostornih granica. A izlažući zajedno radove zrelih i afirmiranih umjetnika s djelima perspektivnih, tek stasalih generacija kolonija se predstavlja i kao poligon prezentacije mladih likovnih neda.

Tako ovogodišnjim prvim, svibanjskim sazivom dominiraju mlade umjetničke osobnosti koje su na Rabu stvarale zajedno sa svojim zrelijim kolegama. Rab su pohodili u svibnju: Elena Ilyina iz Rusije, Natalie Knotkova iz Češke, Ira Skopljak i Snježana Idrizović iz Bosne i Hercegovine, Catherina Zavodnik, Mišo Kokovnik i Lojze Kalinšek iz Slovenije te Jelena Dabić, Lila Herceg, Dora Katanić, Kristina Mareković, Irena Gayatri Horvat, Karolina Pernar Krsnik i Vitar Drinković iz Hrvatske.

Glavna motivacija slikarstvu **Elene Ilyine** unutarnji je svijet žene. Njezinu psihologiju i emociju majstorski pokazuje simbolima, interpolacijom riječi, predstavljajući polarnost ljubavi, sretnu i tužnu stranu, u morfološkoj i kolorističkoj prepoznatljivosti – intenzivnoj boji u koju je uklopljen, uglavnom, monokroman lik.

Ljepota ženskog tijela u nešto drugačijim refleksijama, onim vodenim, prikazana je i u slikama **Lojze Kalinšeka**. U kontrastu zemaljskog i onog mitskog, obitavališta čudesnih bića poput nimfi, Kalinšek, inspiriran lomovima svjetla i titrajima vode, rastače čvrstu formu i vraća je u iskonsko, prirodno.

Žensko tijelo motiv je i skulpture **Snježane Idrizović**. Oblost i podatnost oblika koncentrirana je u malu formu koja svjedoči životnošću tradicije i privlačnosti „klasične“ figurativne skulpture.

No, afiniteti mlade češke umjetnice **Natalie Knotkove** posve su drugačiji. U svom skulptorskem radu poseže za suvremenim tehnološkim materijalima, producira zanimljivu, geometrijsku formu u kojoj propituje odnose boja i oblika otkrivajući nam izrazit osjećaj za emotivni učinak boje, a odabirom dominirajućeg tirkiznog tona potvrđuje i svoju omiljenu temu – a to je voda.

Za zanimljivim materijalom poseže i **Vitar Drinković**. Pčelinji vosak materijal je koji ovaj mladi kipar rado odabire, jer mu pruža neograničene mogućnosti oblikovanja, a njegovim dodatnim koloriranjem iz jedne gotovo primordialne forme prelazi, u samom procesu, u konačnu formu, u suvremeni skulptorski znak - u opominjajuću svemirsku crvotočinu, asocirajući vanjštinom gigantski spermatozoid transformiran u svojoj unutrašnjosti u ženski

spolni organ, primamljivi bezdan u kojeg znatiželjno uranjamamo poglede zavedeni titrajućim svjetлом, lego figuricama i plastičnim životinjicama - nekom novom budućom Noinom arkom.?

Kategorijama vremena i prostora, njihovom relativnosti, inspiracijom teorijom kvantne mehanike i egzistencijom paralelnih svjetova bavi se kroz svoj rad **Karolina Pernar Krsnik**. Njena metalna žica savijena u zaobljenu krivulju, tj. konkretnizirana u skulpturi, zapravo je materijalizirana linija, oprostoren linijski crtež. Postala je Karolinin zaštitni znak, kojeg se ona ne odriče ni na koloniji, a sugerira na vječno kretanje, zatvoreni kružni ciklus, na krvotok kao simbol kretanja života.

Na otkucajima života kao i na konkretnim otkucajima sata sa stoljetnih rapskih zvonika, temelji se rad **Ire Skopljak**. U slici ove mlade autorice crtež je elementaran trag, pot-puno autonoman, jasan i minuciozan, istodobno i imaginaran i narativan, predstavljajući potpuno dovršen stvaralački čin unutar kolažirane slojevitosti papirnatih formi koje tvore ukupnu sliku. Papir i to ne bilo kakav, već onaj tibetanskih svetih spisa, ključan je, simbolični medij i u gradnji slike **Irene Gayatri Horvat**. Na njemu Gayatri zapisuje glagoljicom starohrvatske pjesme uklapajući tako elemente naše nacionalne kulture u slojevitu strukturu slike u kojoj snažan crni trag – oslobođena slikarska gesta odražava likovna i konceptualna propitivanja, poznavanje mogućnosti slikarskog metiera te svestranost i kompleksnost ove mlade žene i umjetnice.

„Zapis i istine“ kao likovne bilješke, kao vizualni dnevnik boravka i rada na Rabu, iščitavaju se u slici **Catharine Zavodnik**. Ovoj multidiscipliniranoj autorici more je važan segment umjetničkog promišljanja, a svoje morske impresije bilježi neopterećena uporabom klasičnih likovnih materijala, slikajući vinom, lijepeći koru drveta, komponirajući svoje minijature crteže rapskih veduta u poetsku priču ispisani i doslovno, na bijelom polju slikarskog platna. Rapska arhitektura, njena čarobna „aria“, trenuci druženja i prizori poznate mediteranske dokolice našli su svoje mjesto na slici **Jelene Dabić**. Brzo bilježenje vlastitih impresija zadržano u izrazu figuracije simpatična je „razglednica“ i sjećanje na veselu družinu s rapske plaže.

Lila Herceg predstavljenim se akvareлом nastavlja na svoje „Obiteljske regresije“, portrete i prizore izvedene iz starih fotografija. Jednu takovu, nastalu na Rabu 1959.g. iskoristila je za svoj rad podražavajući i odabirom kolora vrijeme njezinog nastajanja. Mediteranska fauna i to ona riblja zabilježena je u slici **Miše Kokovnika**. Ovaj slikar veduta i krajobraza odlučio se za mrtvu prirodu u čijoj se jednostavnosti, jasnoći i tonskoj ujednačenosti motiva i podloge iščitavaju i konotativna i simbolična značenja.

A rapsku floru u svojoj morfološkoj prepoznatljivosti donosi na platno **Dora Katanić**. Poput pikselizacije filmske ili digitalne slike i njezina se „Sjena drveta“ razlaže u strukturi intenzivnog, sočnog kolora otkrjujući Dorin interes za propitivanje organskih struktura te utjecaje i efekte boje unutar klasičnog likovnog medija kao što je štafelajna slika. Neformalni likovni oblici, zanimljive organske i anorganske strukture iz kojih se kristaliziraju prepoznatljive figurativne forme, polje su interesa mlade sisačke slikarice **Kristine Mareković**. Ljudski lik kao dio zanimljive apstraktne morfologije glavni je motiv njezine slike.

U mjesecu lipnju upriličena je izložba 31. Saziva likovne kolonije. Na njoj se predstavilo dvanaestero izuzetnih hrvatskih i inozemnih likovnih imena. Heike Pillemann iz Njemačke, Brigitte Brand, Massimo Lomi, Valentino Moradei Gabbielli, Rudy Bar-borini i Alessandro Cadamuro iz Italije, Kle-men Brun iz Slovenije, Nataša Milovančev iz Makedonije, Miloš Prekop i Robert Almaši iz Slovačke te Eugen Varzić i Krešimir Nikšić iz Hrvatske.

Rab kao grad i kao otok, i ovaj put, glavni je motiv slike **Massima Lomia**. Svoj treći boravak na rapskoj koloniji obilježio je diptihom rapskog krajobraza razvučenog u duge horizontale, koji prestaje biti samo reprodukcijom prirodnog, već je i refleksivno monokromno polje unutar kojeg je tonski tretirano plavetnilo akcentirano ekspresivnim bijelim partikulama. Rab zabilježen na drvenoj podlozi emanira toplinom i neobičnom, pomalo zaboravljenom ljepotom. Rapska veduta kao inspirativan motiv našla se i u slici **Brigitte Brand**. Zrači produhovljenom atmosferom koju postiže ograničenim spektrom, transparentnošću i supertilnim odnosom tonova. Čistoća donjeg dijela slike, lijepog u svojoj praznini, likovna je

igra kojom Brigitte vitalizira sliku i formalno potpomaže njenu temu.

Moćna rapska arhitektura, čudesno svjetlo i zamaman pejzaž hipnotički je privukla i talijanskog vizualnog umjetnika i fotografa **Rudya Barborinija**. Medij njegove umjetničke kreacije kolažirana je, dodatno kolorirana fotografija u koju je interpolirao dječji lik, arhetipska znakovlja poput kršćanskih, masonske, židovskih, staroegipatskih, kao temeljnih odrednica i pokretača naše civilizacije.

Simboli, motivi drevnog zaglavnog kamenja kao dijelova opće, ali i nacionalne kulture nalaze se, kao integralni dijelovi i u slici **Eugena Varzića**. Ovaj hrvatski umjetnik kao glavni motiv odabire žensko tijelo koje u polju slike bogate znakovljem i samo postaje simboličnom formom, dijelom nadrealne, fantazmagorične atmosfere u kojoj su, kako i naslovom bilježi, strah i igra glavni akteri.

Opsesija ženskim tijelom, ali kao simbolom ljepote, kao važne pokretačke i stvaralačke snage, likovna je priča slovačkog slikara **Roberta Almašia**. Žena kao trajna inspiracija personificirana je u slikama u oblike prirodnih motiva. Sada je ona cvijet, građen fasetama intenzivnog kolora gdje jedna forma preklapa drugu podražavajući dinamiku kretanja, titraje života, lelujavost i zavodljivost ženskog tijela.

Žena je glavni motiv i slike **Miloša Prekopa**. I ovaj put ona je određen citat povijesti umjetnosti, omage Picassou ili tek opće mjesto, arhetip, opsesija ljepotom afričkih ritualnih maski. Njegova slika deindividualizirana je žena na crvenom tronu u kostimu naglašene linearnosti omekšane ponavljajućim spiralnim formama.

Ekspresivna, gotovo neurotična linija glavni je gradivni element slike **Heike Pillemann**. To su crtačke bilješke, njen dnevnički zapis boravka na Rabu, ispunjen svakodnevnim doživljajima, impresijama arhitekturom, prometnom i ljudskom vrevom, kotačima kao simbolom kretanja, prolaznosti. Stoga je, ovaj bojom obogaćen narativan crtež, zabilježen brzo, ekspresivno, snažnom gestom, kontroliranom tek naoko, određenom antropomorfnom ili predmetnom formom.

Ekspresivnost, gesta, curaže, prskanja kao elementi snažnog slikarstva materije grade morfoliju slike **Klemena Bruna**. Njime ovaj slovenski slikar bilježi vlastiti egzistencijalni trenutak, vlastito postojanje. Oslobođena je to strast zauzdana antropomorfnom formom – ljudskim likom u pokretu. Snaga i ljepota vode, kao jedne od četiriju elemenata, svedene

na čisti likovni znak, konstantno je prisutna u likovnom otkrivanju vlastitog mentalnog pejzaža **Krešimira Nikšića**. Slikom „Mederteran“ potvrđuje svoju egzistenciju u poljima čiste apstrakcije. Platnom se razljevaju kolori mehanizmom spontanog djelovanja, silovite gestualnosti proizašle iz dubokog unutarnjeg poticaja i energije koja emanira iz umjetnika samog. A kiparska preokupacija **Valentina Moradeia Gabbriellia** i dalje je ljudska figura. Stilizirana, površinskog inkarnata koji se materički razlaže, omogućavajući svjetlu oživljavanje statičkog tijela zaustavljenog u svojoj kontemplaciji. Izvedena u podatnome gipsu patiniranom akrilom spoj je tradicionalnog i suvremenog.

Za suvremenim materijalima i novim tehnologijama zadržavajući se u inspirativnom i potencijalnom mediju stakla, poseže izuzetan venecijanski skulptor, performer i konceptualni umjetnik **Alessandro Cadamuro**. Njegovi „Poevetri“ doslovna su poezija stvorena stakлом. Svoje poetske vizije nerijetko upotpunjava i zvučnom kulismom, a u staklo intervenira gravirajući, tj. ugrevavajući vlastite stihove, razbija linearne strukture i formira nove oblike sjedinjavajući ih slovima, znakovima i drugim zanimljivim predmetima.

Od poetskog stakla do „Poetike prostora“ vodi nas rad **Nataše Milovančev**. Predstavljenom slikom podcrtava svoja likovna promišljanja u kojima aktualizira čistoču analitičkog i redukcionističkog promišljanja prostora u duhu geometrijske rekonstrukcije stvarnosti i njezine ponovne sintetizacije u polju slike.

Trideset i drugi, a ovogodišnji treći saziv okupio je tradicionalno „elitu“ hrvatske likovne umjetnosti – Koraljku Kovač, Zlatku Kauzlarica Atača, Tomislava Buntaka, Danka Friščića, Duška Šibla i Vladimira Meglića te ugostio i značajna imena europskog likovnog svijeta: Gam-mu Thesu Terheyden i Burgu Endhardt iz Njemačke, Jožeta Šubica i Borisa Zaplatila iz Slovenije, Grzegorza Wneka iz Poljske i **Serhiya Savchenka** iz Ukrajine. Upravo rad ovog posljednjeg autora potaknuo je određena kulturološka i društveno sociološka pitanja, koja nisu proizašla iz morfološke datosti samog rada, već iz asocijativnosti koju je u nama, percipijentima pobudio proces i kolorističko tretiranje predstavljenog triptiha (crven, bijel i plavi). Tako je njegova „Erupcija“ kolorističke materije postala (Hrvatskom koja plače)

vizualnim simbolom kulturne neosviještenosti, inferiornosti značenja umjetnosti unutar društvenog i kulturnog konteksta jedne zemlje, ali i svijeta u cijelosti. No, ako zanemarimo njegova snažna asocijativna značenja, rad predstavlja sam slikarski proces prirodnih neminovnosti koje se događaju u polju slike. Ona ne bilježi događaje, već ih sama projicira doživljavajući neku vrst vlastite katarze. Iz dubljih slojeva probija se boja poput uzavrele lave. Tako materijal sam stvara sliku dokazujući i Savchenkov interes za fizička djelovanja u slikarskom polju.

O boljem svijetu, arkadiji novopronađene duhovnosti razmišlja **Tomislav Buntak**. Rad sadržava sve formalne i kompozicijske prepoznatljivosti ovog autora, poput napućenosti slike androginim likovima, njihovim odnosom s pejzažom, istraživanja planova prostora, igre sjenama te dominantan crtež koji sve objedinjuje u narativno – figurativan izraz. Njegov „Otok“, iako građen na konkretnom rapskem pejzažu, imaginarno je mjesto na kojem je „užitak osnova življenja“.

Danku Friščiću otok je inspiracijom za neka druga – ona oblikovna i koloristička propitivanja. I njegova umjetnička osobnost dragocjeni je dokaz kako je slikarstvo izvor konstantnih invencija, kako je živo i opet moćno. Friščić gradi neobičan, izmaštan, fantastičan krajobraz tonski tretiran bogatim, otvorenim plavim kolorom, nadrealne atmosfere koja je i inače važan segment njegovog ikonografskog stajališta.

Kontemplativnost i meditativnost plave prisutna je u slici **Koraljke Kovač**. Rad je nastavak njezina eksperimentiranja kombiniranim tehnikama na papiru i papirom kojeg, nerijetko zanimljiva grafička uzorka uslojava, fiksira bojom po kojoj potom intervenira kredom ili grafitom. Taj sliko-crtež nastao na transparentnim slojevima papira ravnopravan je element plohi i boji, gradeći zajedno s njima i ona druga, metafizička i duhovna značenja unutar Koraljkina, simbolikom bogata ultramarina.

Još jedna varijacija u plavom slika je **Jožeta Šubica**. Formulirana je na klasičnom pikturnom postupku organizirane strukture slikarskog polja upotreborom slikarskih i neslikarskih sredstava – poput ušivanja pojedinih gradivnih elemenata koncem. Suzavajući

Sužavajući koloristički registar zadržava se u polju plave boje prilagođavajući svojstva neformalnog slikarstva klasičnoj predodžbi slike stvarajući dopadljiv, pomalo dekorativan enformel.

„Rapsko cvijeće“ **Borisa Zaplatila** slika je bogate strukture koju gradi partikulama geometrijskih formi, floralnim elementima te slobodnim oblicima koji asociraju na organsko podražavajući tako priču o motivu uzetom iz prirode. Predstavljenom slikom Zaplatil se uz Šubica, potvrđuje kao jedan od najproduktivnijih slovenskih umjetnika čije majstorsko poznavanje duhovnosti i učinka boje te značenje likovnih formi uvijek iznova iznenađuje. I **Vladimir Meglić** odabire cvijet kao ključnu točku oko koje gradi svoju koloristički bogatu i prepoznatljivu likovnu priču. Njegovo platno gotovo je reljefno, rađeno je u slojevima -od podslika, brojnih poteza kistom do završne čudesne dojmljivosti pune neke posebne, nadahnute atmosfere, imaginarnog prostora temeljenog na stvarnim prelošcima i uvijek prepoznatljivim, „megličevskim znakom“ – drvenim stolcem.

A tijelo u pokretu zaštitni je znak **Duška Šibla**. On strpljivo gradi vlastitu umjetničku opstojnost koristeći se ovom opsesijom u svim opusima. Njegovi plesači, kao da su izvučeni iz plemenskog rituala, izvode ples stiliziranih pokreta izjednačavajući se s junacima iz „doba sna“, s mjesecевом djecom, arhetipovima na granici materijalnog i duhovnog. Ogrnuti tajanstvenošću, ali i snažnom energijom kojom su prožeti, sablasni plesači utiskuju i pečat ironije spram toliko prisutnih predrasuda koje i danas okružuju svijet umjetnosti. Tijela, konkretno aktovi pod vodom, slikarska su preokupacija **Zlatka Kauzarića Atača**. Svoj dominantan, ekspresivan crtež kojim virtualno bilježi na papir opsesiju tijelom zamjenjuje čistim slikarskim tretiranjem podloge snažnim, prosijavajućim kolorom, oslobođajući svoju slikarsku gestu koju ne zatomljuje figurativnim izričajem. Tijelo doslovno rastače u kolorističkoj materiji koja postaje osnovnim sredstvom njegovog izraza, pretapa se i izranja u nježnim srazovima na površini platna.

„Plivačica“ **Grzegorza Wneka** kao da pliva po samoj površini vode. Ona je lik snažnih

kolorističkih akcenata apliciran na podlogu koja sugerira morsko plavetnilo. Forme su tretirane tako da tvore pročišćenu kompozicijsku osnovu u kojoj je odnos glavnih boja i oblika temeljna zadaća slike.

Stvaralački impuls **Burge Endhardt** ne zaustavlja se na jednoj slici, on raste i razvija se u fazama. Stoga njena slika bilježi tek jedan njihov segment, neposredan izraz nastao nadahnućem rapskim raslinjem, uzgibanim zrakom i vodom. Ona je produkt osobnih autoričinih refleksija, njen duhovni, mentalni krajolik zauzdan u kolopletu treperave linije. I njemačka skulptorka **Gamma Thesa Terheyden** odlučila se predstaviti slikom. Karakteriziraju koloristička zasićenost, svojevrstan *horror vacui* unutar kojeg jedva da prepoznajemo figurativne forme, jer bogati slojevi boje nadograđuju motiv, podčinjeni sam-om stvaralačkom procesu jasne ekspresivnosti kontrolirane geste koju često oformljuje u slovnom znaku.

Today when the endeavours in the field of culture and creativity tend to be in advance proclaimed as ineffectual and naive, in these times when values are turned upside-down, when morality is inferior to other values, when wrong icons are revered and the true human communication is virtually nonexistent, the attempts of individuals to emphasize the opposite, to point to the need for the existence of spiritual oases, of cultural and artistic micro-cosmoses within this chaotic universe are particularly precious. Since the year 2000 Art colony Paradiso has been identifying such needs, as well as emphasizing the currency and vitality of art, the unacceptability of the status quo, the wealth of creative output appearing in spite of the epochal crisis, and the appearance of new ideas that artists keep setting forth through their work. This is why every year since 2000 Art colony Paradiso, a project run by Makek-Paradiso Gallery, opens its door to art lovers and artists in order to show that artistic practice is very much alive, unique and unceasing. The colony both presents and connects Croatian and international contemporary fine art production, aiming to affirm the need for global reflection and action by means of bringing together different stylistic, iconic and cultural expressions. By organising the Art colony, which takes European art as a starting point without being restricted to it, Makek-Paradiso Gallery emphasizes the importance of European cultural unity as well as the importance of presenting and promoting one's own country. As in previous years the colony was organised in three sessions, with an exhibition show held after each meeting. Placing the town of Rab onto the map of European arts as a significant cultural location, the colony this year welcomed three groups of Croatian and international artists, displaying the works they created during their stay in Rab in three exhibitions. Thirty-eight artists from eleven European countries have transposed their experiences into various forms of expression, into personal acts which, by becoming reality, convey ideas of beauty and of a new spirituality, and bear witness to global reflection and the insignificance of temporal and spatial boundaries. Displaying the works of mature and renowned artists alongside those of promising young generations, the colony takes the role of a platform for the presentation of gifted young artists.

This year's first meeting of the colony, held in May, welcomed predominantly young artists who created their work alongside their more established colleagues. The following artists visited Rab in May: Elena Ilyina from Russia, Natalie Knotkova from the Czech Republic, Ira Skopljak and Snježana Idrizović from Bosnia and Herzegovina, Catherine Zavodnik, Mišo Kokovnik and Lojze Kalinšek from Slovenia, and Jelena Dabić, Lila Herceg, Dora Katanić, Kristina Mareković, Irena Gayatri Horvat, Karolina Pernar Krsnik and Vitar Drinković from Croatia.

The main inspiration in the painting of **Elena Ilyina** is the inner world of a woman. She masterly represents female psychology and emotion using symbols and interpolated words, presenting the polarity of love and its joyful and gloomy sides through her morphologically and coloristically recognizable style – a mostly monochrome figure inserted into an intensive colour.

The paintings of **Lojze Kalinšek** also depict the beauty of the female body, although by means of somewhat different reflections, those refracted through water. Contrasting the mundane and the mythical, the real and the realm of the fantastical populated by nymphs, inspired by refractions of light

and shimmering of water, he unravels the solid form and returns it to the primeval, the natural.

A woman's body is the inspiration for the sculpture of **Snježana Idrizović**, too. The roundness and plasticity of shapes is here concentrated within a small form demonstrating the vitality of tradition and the attraction of the 'classical' representational sculpture. However, the preferences of a young Czech artist **Natalie Knotková** are entirely different. In her sculptural expression she reaches for contemporary technological materials to produce an appealing geometrical form through which she explores the relationships between colour and shape, revealing an exquisite feeling for the emotional impact of colour, while her selection of the predominant turquoise shade confirms her favourite theme – water. An interesting choice of medium characterises yet another artist, **Vitar Drinković**. Beeswax is the medium this young sculptor prefers as it gives immense possibilities for sculpting,

while additional colouring transforms it, in the very process, from an almost primeval form into a final shape, a contemporary sculptural sign – an admonishing cosmic wormhole whose outside appearance suggests a giant sperm cell transformed on the inside into female genitals, an alluring abyss into which we curiously immerse our gaze seduced by the shimmering of light, Lego figurines and small plastic animals – some new, future Noah's Ark.?

Karolina Pernar Krsnik through her work addresses the categories of time and space, their relativity, the quantum mechanics theory and the existence of parallel worlds. Her metal wire bent into curving shapes, that is, concretised through the form of a sculpture, actually represents a materialised line, a drawing transformed into three dimensions. This has become her trademark, which she pursues in this colony as well, and it suggests permanent motion, a closed cycle, the bloodstream as the symbol of the continuance of life. The work of **Ira Skopljak** on the other hand is based on the beats of life and on the actual beats of the clock coming from the centuries old bell-towers of Rab. In the canvas of this young artist a drawing represents the elementary trace, completely autonomous, clear and meticulous, both imaginary and narrative, an entirely completed creative act within a collage of layered paper forms making up the painting as a whole.

Paper is also a key symbolic medium in the construction of the paintings of **Irena Gayatri Horvat**, and not any kind of paper but that used in the Tibetan sacred books. Gayatri uses it to inscribe old Croatian poems in Glagolitic script, integrating thus the elements of our national culture into a stratified structure of a painting in which a strong dark trace – a liberated painterly gesture – reflects artistic and conceptual explorations, knowledge of the painterly profession, and the versatility and complexity of this young woman and artist.

'The records of Truth', as painterly notes and as a visual diary about the residence and work in Rab, can be read from the paintings of **Catherina Zavodnik**. The sea represents an important segment of creative thinking for this multi-disciplinary artist, who records her impressions of the sea without feeling the necessity to use traditional painting materials, and paints with wine, sticks pieces of tree bark, or integrates her miniature drawings of Rab

panoramas within the poetic story written literally on the white surface of the canvas. The architecture of Rab, its magical 'aria', the moments spent together and the scenes of familiar Mediterranean leisure have found their place in the paintings of **Jelena Dabić**. A quick sketching of her own impressions, contained in a figurative expression, presents a lovely 'postcard' a recollection of the merry crowd on the beach.

With the watercolour presented in Rab, **Lila Herceg** continues her 'Family Regressions', portraits and scenes originating from old photographs. One such photograph, made in Rab in 1959, she uses in her work, emphasizing by her choice of colour the time when the photograph was made.

The Mediterranean underwater fauna is recorded in the work of **Mišo Kokovnik**. This painter of landscapes and cityscapes now opted for a still life, whose simplicity, clarity, and a tonal balance of motifs and the base emanates both connotative and symbolic meanings.

The flora of Rab, with its characteristic morphology, is found in the canvas of **Dora Katanić**. As in pixelization of a film or digital image, her 'Shadow of a Tree' is broken down into a structure of intense, ripe colour, revealing her interest in questioning of organic structures and the impacts of the paint in the classic painting medium such as easel painting.

Informal shapes, curious organic and inorganic structures from which emerge recognizable representational forms, represent the scope of interests of a young painter from Sisak, **Kristina Mareković**. The human figure, as part of an interesting abstract morphology, is the main motif in her work.

An exhibition show of the thirty-first meeting of the Art colony was organised in June. Twelve exceptional artists from Croatia and abroad presented their work in this exhibition. They included Heike Pillemann from Germany, Brigitte Brand, Massimo Lomi, Valentino Moradei Gabbrielli, Rudy Barborini and Alessandro Cadamuro from Italy, Klemen Brun from Slovenia, Nataša Milovančev from Macedonia, Miloš Prekop and Robert

Almaši from Slovakia and Eugen Varzić and Krešimir Nikšić from Croatia.

Rab as a town and as an island was once again the main motif of **Massimo Lomi**'s painting. He marked his third visit to Rab colony by a diptych of a Rab landscape stretched across the horizontal dimension, ceasing to be only a reproduction of the natural and becoming a reflexive monochromatic field in which the tonally treated blue is accentuated by expressive white specks. When recorded on wood, Rab emanates warmth and an unusual, slightly forgotten beauty.

As a very inspirational motif, Rab as a cityscape also found its place in **Brigitte Brand**'s painting. It radiates a spiritual ambiance achieved by a limited spectre, transparency and subtle tonal relationships. The clean-cut lower area of the painting, beautiful in its emptiness, represents a painterly play Brigitte uses to vitalise the painting and formally underline its theme.

The impressive architecture of Rab, the amazing light and alluring landscapes have hypnotically attracted the Italian visual artist and photographer **Rudy Barborini**. The medium of his artistic creation is a photograph composed by collage and subsequently coloured, interpolated by a figure of a child and archetypal Christian, Masonic, Jewish, and old Egyptian symbols as fundamental parameters of our civilisation.

Symbols and motifs taken off ancient tombstones as elements of a national culture are also found as integral parts in the painting of **Eugen Varzić**. This Croatian artist takes the female body as his main motif, which in the painting rich in signs becomes itself a symbolic form and a part of the surreal, phantasmagorical atmosphere where, as the title suggests, fear and play are the main protagonists.

An obsession with a female body as a symbol of beauty and as an important driving and creative force makes up the painterly narrative of Slovakian artist **Robert Almaši**. Woman as an everlasting inspiration is in his paintings personified into natural forms. She is here a flower, constructed by facets of intensive colour where one form overlays another suggesting the dynamics of movement, quivers of life, swaying and seductiveness of a female body.

A woman is the main motif in the painting of **Miloš Prekop**. She is again a quotation from art history, homage to Picasso, or perhaps a general site, an archetype, an obsession

with the beauty of African ritual masks? His painting gives us a de-individualised woman on a red throne in a costume of accentuated linearity softened by a repetition of spiral forms. Expressive, almost neurotic line is the principal constitutive element of **Heike Pillemann's** painting. It appears as notes in form of a drawing, a diary entry about her stay in Rab filled with everyday events, impressions, architecture, traffic and human crowds, wheels as symbolic of movement and of transience. For this reason this narrative drawing completed by paint has been done quickly, expressively, with a strong gesture controlled by some only apparently defined anthropomorphic form or object.

Expressivity, gesture, dripping and splashing as elements of the powerful painting of the matter construct the morphology of **Klemen Brun's** work. The Slovenian artist uses this painting to mark his own existential moment, his own reality. It is a liberated passion contained by an anthropomorphic form – a human figure in motion.

The power and the beauty of water as one of the four elements, reduced to a pure painterly sign, are constantly present in the artistic revelation of the personal mental landscape of **Krešimir Nikšić**. With his painting 'The Mediterranean' he confirms his own existence in the space of pure abstraction. The colours are poured across the canvas in a spontaneous manner by a commanding gestural movement springing from a deep inner stimulus and from the energy that emanates from the artist himself.

The human figure remains the sculptural concern of **Valentino Moradei Gabbrielli**. It is stylised, with a surface flesh colour that allows the light to enliven the static body frozen in its contemplation. The sculpture is made in flexible plaster patinated by acrylic, bringing together the traditional and the contemporary.

While remaining in the inspirational and promising medium of glass, the brilliant Venetian sculptor, performer and conceptual artist **Alessandro Cadamuro** chooses contemporary materials and new technologies. His 'Poevetri' (Poeglass) is literally poetry made by glass. He often completes his poetic visions by sound, and he works on the glass by engraving, or rather, scratching, his own verses into it, breaking linear structures and creating new forms by merging them with letters, symbols and other interesting objects.

The work of **Nataša Milovančev** takes us from the poetic glass to the 'Poetry of Space'. Her painting underlines her artistic considerations through which she brings about the clarity of analytical and reductionist thinking about space in the spirit of a geometrical reconstruction of reality and its repeated synthetisation in the field of the painting.

The thirty-second meeting of the colony, and the third meeting this year, has traditionally gathered the elite of Croatian fine arts – Koraljka Kovač, Zlatko Kauzlaric Atač, Tomislav Buntak, Danko Friščić, Duško Šibl and Vladimir Meglić, and welcomed some eminent names from the European artistic world: Gamma Thesa Terheyden and Burga Endhardt from Germany, Jože Šubic and Boris Zaplatil from Slovenia, Grzegorz Wnek from Poland and **Serhiy Savchenko** from Ukraine. The morphology of the work itself, but from the associations we as perceivers experience when faced with the colourist treatment of the presented triptych (red, white and blue). His 'Eruption' of colourist matter has thus become (Croatia weeping in) a visual symbol of cultural unawareness, inferiority of art within a social and cultural context of a country, as well as the world as a whole. However, such strong associative meanings aside, the work represents the painting process itself, the process of natural inevitabilities that occur in the space of the canvas. It does not record events but projects them itself, experiencing a kind of catharsis. The paint forces its way from the lower layers like molten lava. The medium thus creates the painting by itself, attesting to Savchenko's interest in physical interactions in the field of the painting.

Tomislav Buntak is concerned with thoughts of a better world, of arcadia of a newly found spirituality. His work possesses all of his formal and compositional characteristics, such as a wealth of androgynous figures and their relationship to landscape, a wealth of androgynous figures and their relationship to landscape, exploration of spatial plans, play of shadows, and a dominant drawing integrating all of the elements into a narrative-representational expression. His 'Island', although based on an actual Rab landscape, is an imaginary place where 'enjoyment is the principle of life'.

For **Danko Friščić** the island is an inspiration for some other explorations – those concerning form and colour. His artistic personality is another valuable evidence of painting as a source

of continual invention, as very much alive and powerful. Friščić constructs an unusual, imagined, fantastic landscape tonally treated by a rich blue colour, enveloped in a surreal atmosphere that is always an important segment of his iconographic point of view.

Contemplative and meditative quality of the blue is present in the painting of **Koraljka Kovač**. The work is a continuation of her experiment with mixed media on paper and with graphically patterned paper which she often fixates with paint on which she then draws in chalk or graphite. This painting-drawing created on transparent layers of paper is an equal element to the surface and the paint, building with them other metaphysical and spiritual significations within the painter's symbolically rich ultramarine.

Yet another variation in blue is the painting by **Jože Šubic**. It is created by a classical pictorial procedure of organising the structure of the painting field using painterly and non-painterly media – such as sawing certain structural elements onto the canvas. Narrowing the range of colours, he remains in the blue spectre adjusting the characteristics of informal painting techniques to the traditional idea of a painting, and creating a likable, slightly decorative material painting.

'The Flowers of Rab' by **Boris Zaplatil** is a painting of rich structure built by elements of geometrical shapes, floral segments and free forms resembling the organic, thus suggesting a narrative about motifs taken from nature. With this work Zaplatil, alongside Šubic, proves to be one of the most productive Slovenian artists whose masterly knowledge of spirituality and the impact of colour always surprise us anew.

Vladimir Meglić also chooses a flower as a key point around which he constructs his colorfully rich and recognizable visual narrative. His canvas is almost a relief, constructed in layers – from the underdrawing, numerous brush strokes, to the final wondrous impressiveness filled with some special, inspired atmosphere, an imagined space based on real models and with an always re-cognizable 'Meglić's trademark', a wooden chair.

The trademark of **Duško Šibl**, on the other hand, is a body in movement. He patiently builds his creative reality using this obsession in his entire opus. His dancers, as if extracted from a tribal ritual, dance with stylised movements, resembling the heroes from the 'age of sleep', the children of the Moon, the archetypes on the border between the material and the spiritual. Wrapped in

secrecy and fierce energy, the ghostly dancers also imprint a mark of irony directed towards the magnitude of prejudice that surrounds the art world even today. Bodies, or rather, nudes under water, represent the artistic preoccupation of **Zlatko Kauzlarić Atač**. His commanding, expressive drawing, which he uses to virtually record an obsession with the body, is replaced by a pure painterly treatment of the canvas by a powerful, radiant spectre, liberating his painterly gesture unrestrained by representational formulations. He literally unravels the solid corporeal form in the medium of paint that becomes his principal means of expression, dissolving and emerging in gentle clashes on the plane of the painting.

'A Swimmer' by **Grzegorz Wnek** seems to be swimming on the very surface of the water. This is a figure of strong colourist accents applied to the base suggesting the blueness of the sea. The forms are treated in such a way as to construct a clear compositional base, bringing out the relationship between the colours and shapes as the main purpose of the work. The creative impulse of **Burga Endhardt** is not exhausted in one work; it grows and develops in stages. Her painting therefore displays just one segment, an immediate expression appearing as a result of inspiration by the vegetation of Rab and the movements of air and water. It is a product of the painter's reflections, her spiritual and mental landscape controlled by a whirl of shimmering lines. The German sculptor **Gamma Thesa Terheyden** also decided to introduce herself by a painting. It is saturated by colours, appearing as a certain *horror vacui* within which we hardly recognise representational forms as the rich layers of paint complement the motif subordinated to the creative process itself, characterised by a clear expression of a controlled gesture often realised through alphabetic signs.


Robert Almaši



Alessandro Cadamuro


Thesa Gamma Terheyden




Dora Katanić

Dobitnik je mnogih nagrada za slikarstvo i scenografiju i ordena Danice za zasluge u kulturi. Atačev egzistiranje u poljima slikarskog obilježili su radovi – oni prvi nastali za njegova djelovanja unutar grupe „Biafra“ (od 1970.g.), portreti poznatih osoba u izražajnom pokretu, aktovi te brojni autoaktovi. Od samih početaka autor baštini osjećaj za ekspresiju trenutka, ritam, pokret te karakterističnu umjetničku angažiranost. Trenutna slikarska preokupacija aktovi su uronjeni u vodu u kojima crtež biva zamijenjen dominacijom čistog slikarskog tretiranja podlage kolorom, otkrivajući svu virtuznost vršnog majstora koji ekspresiju ne zatomljuje figurativnim izričajem.

Born in Koprivnica, Croatia in 1945. After completing secondary education he enrolls in the Academy of Fine Arts. During his studies he takes part in the activities of the Experimental Student Theatre. He graduated in the class of Professor Miljenko Stančić and immediately joined the master workshop of Professor Krsto Hegedušić. In 1973 he became an assistant professor at the Academy of Fine Arts in Zagreb where he still works, and has been a dean for a period of time. As well as in painting and graphics, he works extensively in set and costume design, and has worked on a hundred of theatre projects in Croatia and abroad, as well as on a number of film and television projects. He has authored several artistic interventions in public spaces. In 1996 Tonko Maroević published Atač's monograph. Atač has received numerous painting and set design awards, as well as the Order of Danica Hrvatska for his contributions to cultural heritage. His presence in painting has been marked by a range of artworks – from early works created during his activity in Biafra Group (since 1970), to portraits of famous people engaged in expressive movement, to nudes and numerous self-portraits in the nude. From the very outset this painter has possessed a sense for the expression of the moment, rhythm and movement, and a typical artistic commitment. Atač's current painterly preoccupations are nudes submerged in water, which reveal how drawing is replaced by the domination of a purely painterly treatment of the canvas, disclosing the virtuosity of the eminent master who does not confine the expression to representational formulations.


Mišo Kokovnik






Serhiy Savchenko


Boris Zaplatil
